Materials: You can choose to make EmBracelets from strands of wool, embroidery thread or even strips of material – think about recycling no longer needed clothes or textiles.

Method: There are lots of different styles and patterns available. The bracelets can be created by plaiting, knotting, knitting, crocheting and look great when accessorised with beads and buttons too. And perhaps add a message of hope and support to each EmBracelet you make.
